Highlights

We are pleased to see strong results in the area of *Education Quality*. Our school's overall rating in the area of *citizenship* improved from good to excellent. In the area of *Education Quality* we maintained an overall excellent rating and in the area of *parental involvement* our overall rating improved from acceptable to excellent. Our efforts to improve our social media presence, family events and overall communication with parents appears to have had a positive impact. Significant progress is observed in the area of *Access to Supports and Services*, with a notable improvement from 79.9 to 87.6. This is reflective of our deep commitment to enhancing resources for students. We believe our unwavering commitment to best practices in the areas of parent engagement, inclusion, literacy and numeracy will continue to support learning and growth in our community.

Challenges to Address

With a sustained focus on our F.L.E.E.T. Evaluation

Staff are focused on new curriculum implementation and on learning how the new resources can support increased student engagement. Another strategy we are using to increase engagement is by highlighting and celebrating student growth and success.

We will be working in collaboration with the University of Lethbridge on an ED 2500 Pilot Project where we will host a cohort of 20 ED 2500 students at Fleetwood from January to April. By utilizing eager pre-service teachers to provide ongoing, consistent, and targeted supports in the areas of literacy and numeracy. We also have 15 Indigenous Students participating in free online live tutoring sessions provided by ChapterOne.org.to support increasing student reading in the areas of fluency and comprehension.

Teachers, parents and students rate the overall quality of basic education as excellent. The staff at Fleetwood embrace inclusion and diversity, and have created an environment that embraces all learners. Fleetwood Bawden enhances school spaces to support students readiness to learn, including: 1) an active self-regulation space with a trampoline, climbing wall, swing, punching bags, medicine balls and a body squeeze machine. 2) a calming room equipped with a comfy furniture, soft lighting, a screen to bring nature in and a cocoon swing. 3) a Student Wellness Centre 4) a Learning Commons space with plans for new materials and structures to allow students to build and create and 5) active hallways with floor stickers, trampolines, bikes, safe spaces, tents and tables set up in hallways to provide alternate learning spaces.

Evaluation

Fleetwood is in the process of revitalizing school culture, while sustaining a welcoming, respectful, safe and caring learning environment. With doors remaining locked for security, we see less parents in our building on a consistent and regular basis. We are curious if locked doors have a role in not feeling welcome. We have added fresh red paint to the outside of our entrances. We've added signage to our exterior doors welcoming families into our building. This Fall we removed bulletin boards from hallways, while at the same time enhanced the bulletin boards we have. New visual messages were added to our office area. We are working on making our front office more inviting; and we are reflecting on current practices and processes to ensure we are providing a more restorative, welcoming, supportive and respectful space.

Evaluation

Our Learning Support Teacher and admin continue connect families with outside supports and services when school-based teams are not able to provide the level of support required. (Family Centre, Bridges, AHS, FSCD, etc.) We continue to build capacity of staff on school and community supports available for students and families to access. We have made improvements to our newsletter by adding mental health and community support information and we add helpline information for those in our community requiring supports. We also refer families to our Family Support Workers as an additional and more intensive level of support.

<u>Evaluation</u>

Parental Involvement was an area of focus at Fleetwood, and the data shows growth in this area. Overall, teachers and parents rate parental involvement in decisions about their child's education as excellent. This is a significant improvement and the highest rating since 2019.

An area of concern is that teachers rate parents at the acceptable level of involvement. As a staff, we will continue to increase parent involvement with decisions about their child's education. We will involve our School Council by engaging in conversations about how we can improve in this area.

<u>Evaluation</u> The overall results have remained at an excellent rating for students receiving a broad program of studies. For a school of our size we have adequate technology including two computer labs, a classroom cart of laptops and classroom cart of iPads. In addition to adequate access to technology, we also have an incredible music room equipped with a multitude of instruments and a gym with a storage room stocked with equipment. We are slowly purging old equipment and replacing it as needed. This Fall we installed 3 basketball hoops of various sizes, and painted several hopscotch and four-square games on our outdoor paved surfaces. Our students have the opportunity to participate and perform in after-school choir clubs, drama club and grade 5 basketball.
