#### **Areas of success**

Highlights— We continue to see strong results in our school's overall rating in the areas of *Citizenship, Education Quality and Welcoming, Caring, Respectful and Safe Learning Environments. We* continue to maintain high ratings and are above the Provincial average in these areas. We will continued to focus on our F.L.E.E.T. Philosophy (Friendships Matter, Learn From Mistakes, Embrace Diversity, Encourage Each Other, Together is Better) in hopes of continued growth and improvement in the area of Welcoming, Caring, Respectful and Safe Learning Environments and to meet an excellent standard in this area.

#### Areas for growth

Challenges—Our school continues to have challenges with accessing supports and services for our most complex and vulnerable learners. Increased division and community wrap-around supports are necessary to keep students from 'falling through the cracks'. Schools are limited in the supports we are able to offer; wrap-around community supports are essential to ensuring a child is supported with what they need to be successful. Some of the barriers and challenges we face are 1. family access to physicians, pediatricians or child psychiatrists. 2. family access to affordable supports and services for trauma, disordered eating and attachment 3. funding shortages for educational assistants to support our most complex students. *Parental Involvement* is another area we are striving for growth. With finding efficiencies on how we communicate with parents, with small changes on how we deliver report cards, and with more invitations for parental volunteering, we hope to see increased growth in parental involvement.

- The continuation of the "Little Spot Series" and "Second Step" being implemented by our Teacher Counsellor during regular and ongoing universal lessons will help build a common language

Challenges: There was decline noted by teachers in this area. Teachers continue to dedicate time and effort to model and teach the characteristics of active citizenship and our school's overall rating in the area of *Citizenship* continues to be excellent. It should be noted that teachers have rated this assurance measure as excellent consistently for several years, but this measure has recently declined. Teachers have expressed concerns and worries about student accountability in the area of citizenship. Teachers are starting to experience increased expectations from parents for children's behaviour and social interactions with peers. (citizenship).

#### Evaluation

Staff are continuing to focus on creating cultures of learning. Teachers are striving to create learning environments that are engaging for all learners. Teachers continue to meet curricular and assessment expectations and challenges set by Alberta Learning. Teachers continue to engage students in their learning by celebrating student successes and by goal-setting to improve student growth and development in many areas.

Challenges—Teachers are more vocal about the challenges of managing complex classrooms. Teachers have expressed concerns about the provincial assessments at the beginning of the school year, as they can hinder the time available to build routines and set classroom expectations. The government assessments focus on what kids <u>know</u>, and this form of standardized assessment is not engaging for student learning. Teachers have expressed the increasing numbers of students with diagnosis' and environmental factors that impact learning can hinder a student's ability to engage. The increased dependence on screen time and lack of active play outside of school has also been a discussion among staff as to why engaging students with curriculum is a challenge.

#### **Evaluation**

Parents and students rate the overall quality of basic education as excellent. The staff at Fleetwood embrace inclusion and diversity, and have created an environment that embraces all learners. Fleetwood Bawden enhances a number of school spaces to support student readiness to learn, including: 1) an active self-regulation space with a trampoline, climbing wall, swing, punching bags, medicine balls and a body squeeze machine. 2) a calming room equipped with a comfy furniture, soft lighting, a cocoon swing, and a screen to bring images of nature indoors (lack of windows in our school). 3) a Student Wellness Centre 4) a Learning Commons space with plans for new materials and structures to allow students to build and create and 5) active hallways with floor stickers, trampolines, stationary bikes, safe spaces, tents and tables set up to provide alternate learning spaces.

Challenge- Teachers have expressed the quality of education is being impacted by the increased student complexities in the class-room.

#### **Evaluation**

Teachers and parents appreciate our schools ability to create a welcoming, caring, respectful, and safe learning environment for students. The staff at Fleetwood are a special team of educators who care deeply about all students. The staff have a reputation in our community of being highly restorative, inclusive and supportive. Our office staff is warm and friendly and supports students and families in a genuine authentic manner.

Challenges—There are times when student behaviour and heightened emotional dysregulation can impact how safe students feel at school. There are increasing numbers of students unable to regulate in the classroom and their explosive and aggressive behaviours can trigger students making them feel unsafe. Safety planning and Behaviour Support Plans are in place to manage these increasing situations.

#### **Evaluation**

Our Learning Support Team (Admin, LST and Teacher Counsellor) continue connect families with outside supports and services when school is not able to manage the level of support required. We continue to build capacity with all staff on what school and community supports are available for students and families to access.

Challenges—There are barriers to appropriate supports and services. There is also a lack of communication from government and community agencies in regard to what supports are available or no longer accessible to families. Barriers include: 1. family access to a physicians, pediatricians or child psychiatrists. 2. family access to affordable supports and services for trauma, disordered eating and attachment 3. lack of funding for educational assistants to support our most complex students.

#### Evaluation

#### Evaluation

The overall results have remained at an excellent rating in the area of satisfaction with the opportunity for students to receive a broad program of studies. Fleetwood has a holistic approach to teaching children. We changed one computer lab space to a classroom, but we still believe we have adequate access to technology. We purchased new ukeleles this year and will continue to apply for grants to support the purchase of more instruments to supplement the music program. We continue to purge old PE equipment for classroom and playground use, and replace equipment as the budget allows.
